DISAFFILIATION AND AFFILIATION UPDATES

Our Administrative Council met on April 17, and they want to share several updates with our church family:

- The Mississippi Annual Conference will vote on our request for disaffiliation at their annual meeting on June 28, 2023.
- Our cost for disaffiliation (two years of apportionments and any unfunded pension liability) follows the Book of Discipline's guidelines and are dollars that we have covenanted to pay to the annual conference. Those funds will be paid to the Annual Conference on July 5.
 - ♦ We will have paid six months of apportionments by that time, so we will only owe \$405,000 in apportionments for the remaining 18 months.
 - The unfunded pension liability was set on April 1 and our church will find out that number on May 15. The estimate we received at our October 2 Exploration Meeting was \$658,301 and the current cost should be similar.
 - ♦ The Finance Committee has set aside funds to pay some portion of the costs for disaffiliation.
 - We plan to add the remaining portion of the Annual Conference costs to the new loan for the Education Building, since it is possible that we will have to refinance that note due to our disaffiliation.
- A sub-committee from our Administrative Council has been working since June 2022 to research denominations with which to potentially affiliate.
 - The sub-committee studied five denominations in the Wesleyan tradition and made a presentation to our Administrative Council this week. The Council voted to propose two of those denominations to our church family for potential affiliation the Global Methodist Church and the Congregational Methodist Church. The other three denominations had many strengths, but they also had enough concerns, like trust clauses that bind a church's property to the denomination, so our Council withdrew them from our consideration.
 - ♦ The Council is asking representatives from the two denominations to speak to our membership in the next few weeks. Details are forthcoming. Those meetings will also be recorded so you can watch them anytime on our YouTube channel.
 - Members from the sub-committee and our pastors will be available to meet with Sunday School classes, small groups, and individuals so please email the committee at nextsteps@madisonumc.org to set a date for that.
 - ♦ Lastly, the sub-committee will also produce a Resource Guide with comparison charts of the two denominations' beliefs and structure. You can find that guide on our church website beginning April 27 at www.madisonumc.org/nextsteps.
- The Administrative Council decided it would be advantageous for many reasons (loans, paperwork, emotional closure, continuous accountability, and more) to vote for our denominational affiliation prior to Memorial Day and the Council will set the date and procedure for that vote soon. As with our disaffiliation vote, only church members will vote on our future affiliation. The procedure of that vote will be forthcoming in the following days.
- It is our hope to make this a smooth transition so that we can continue to focus on the missions, ministries, and fellowship of our church family.

MUMC will participate in building a new house with Habitat for Humanity during May and June. This project is named the "Faith Build" because it will be funded and built as a cooperative effort by the congregations of Methodist, Episcopal, Catholic, Presbyterian, Baptist, and non-denominational churches in the Mississippi Capitol area.



The home is being built for Latonia Blackmon and her five children and will have five bedrooms and two and a half bathrooms. It will be located at 4663 Estelle Drive in the Broadmoor neighborhood in Jackson. Workdays will be Thursday and Saturday of each week beginning April 29 and continuing to completion in late June.

MUMC will have a dedicated day on June 3, when we will be completing the walls by installing sheathing, top plates, and plumbing the walls in preparation to installing roof trusses. 


